### **Financial Aid**

#### **End of Year Reconciliation**

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As the 201819 academic year comes to a close, the Financial Aid Office is working to reconcile all federal financial aid programs for the Sept. 30 closeout required for the Department of Education.

The following represents a breakdown of the number of students and funds received for the 2018-19 school year:

Pell Grant - 1004 recipients - \$3,475,755.00 Federal Student Loans -747 recipients - \$3,009,617.00 Supplemental Opportunity Grant - 541 recipients - \$117,150.00 Federal College Work Study – 35 recipients- \$46,901.00 Federal Financial Aid total: \$6,649,423.00

Registrar/Records

Career and Counseling Services gave a presentation in August to faculty and staff concerning typical mental health problems experienced by SSCC students.
