For years, Jack has pretended to have a troublesome brother named Ernest. In fact, Ernest is Jack's pseudonym, an alibi that lets him go off and do as he pleases. No one knows that Jack himself is Ernest. Algernon Moncieff (Adomas Fabin), cousin to the lovely Gwendolen Fairfax (Hannah Hengler), has begun to suspect the man he knows as Ernest may be living a double life, which he approves of, regarding it as normal behavior. Jack plans to propose to Gwendolen, despite her mother Lady Bracknell's (Leslie Holmes) protestations. And once Algernon learns of Jack's sister Cecily, he runs off to the country to propose to her, as Jack's "brother" Ernest. The problems are resolved in an extremely charming and quite unexpectedywas Jack and Algernon discover the importance of being earnest while answering to the name of Ernest.
